Updated Brewery Creek Mineral Resource Estimate and the Restart Plan

Our most important work this year is the completion of these two studies currently underway. This work should be completed in the next 45 to 60 days despite the impact of COVID-19.

Planned 2020 Field Activities

This year's budget includes drill programs at Brewery Creek. We are evaluating whether or not it makes sense to proceed with this program given the difficult operating requirements imposed by the virus and the need to protect our work crews. Potentially we could complete some drilling as late as the Fall and note that delaying this program would not impact our future plans to restart Brewery Creek. Ongoing compliance with our existing licenses and regulatory authorizations continues and we are pleased to note that the spring freshet went smoothly, as usual, despite the excessive snowfall in the Yukon.
